What will happen on the day?

The overall aim of the day is to agree the 10 most important research questions to do with life after stroke. These will come from the list of 24 top questions which you have been sent as a separate document.

Start of the day. Please come to room A423 on the 4th floor of the Govan Mbeki Building. This room will be sign-posted as “JLA meeting” from the front door. If you require assistance please contact Bridget before hand, or ask at the reception desk. You will be given a name-badge and meeting materials. Tea & coffee will be available.

Welcome. Lester Firkins (chair of the JLA) will give a short informal talk. He will explain more about what will happen during the day, and where the questions that we are discussing have come from.

Small group work. We will divide into 3 groups of around 8 people. These small groups will discuss their individual rankings of the 24 questions (it would be helpful if you have completed your own ranking before the meeting). Each group will work together to agree a joint top 10 questions for their group. A facilitator will help each group through the process.

Lunch break. A light sandwich lunch will be served in our main meeting room. Please inform us in advance if you have special dietary requirements.

Agreeing the final top 10. We will come together as a whole group and Lester Firkins will tell us how the 3 small groups have ranked their questions. He will highlight where there are similarities and differences. Everyone will be invited to discuss until we have agreed a final top 10.

Conclusions. After a refreshment break, the whole group will discuss and agree what happens next. Who do we want to know about this top 10? What do we need to do to make sure this important research happens?
